

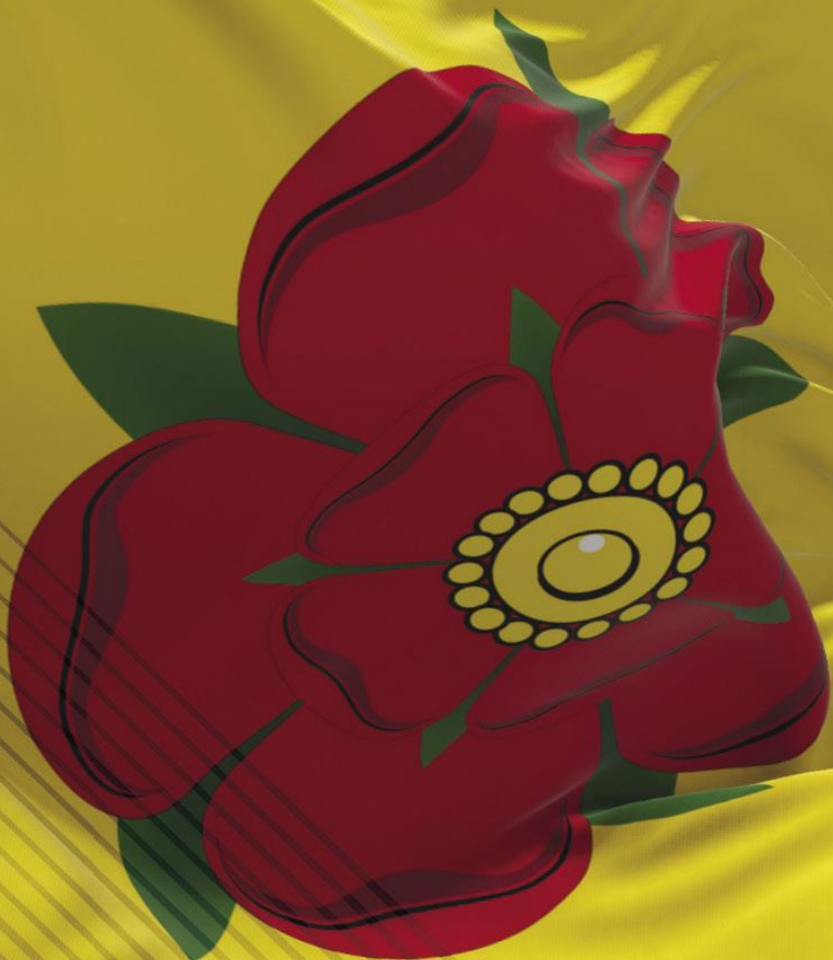

Priorities for the strand

1. To improve attainment for all children across the region, particularly in literacy and numeracy.
2. To ensure vulnerable families get the help they need for their children to progress and achieve.
3. To support vulnerable young people and families by removing barriers to learning and helping them access opportunity.
4. To improve multi-agency working to make sure all our children have the best possible start in life.

SEND Places

Actions completed:

- SEND Service managers to meet Pan-Lancashire
- Sharing of best practice regarding sufficiency of SEND places and wider school places

- Next steps
- Agreement on Data sharing of places inside and outside county
- Further actions to be agreed by leads

Addresses all four priorities

Attendance and CME

Actions completed:

- Team managers for Attendance and CME to meet
- Develop consistent legal approach to attendance

Next steps :

- Creation of Pan Lancashire attendance strategy/toolkit
- Creation of Pan Lancashire CME Protocol aligning processes
- Creation of consistent admissions processes across Lancashire
- Reducing number of children EHE by sharing best practice and coordinating responses to requests for EHE

Addresses all four priorities

Behaviour Management

Actions completed:

- Roll out of Pan-Lancashire Behaviour Mark
- Sharing best practice regular meetings between three authorities
- Education Serious Violence Co-Ordinator appointed funded by Violence Reduction Unit to work pan-Lancashire on reducing serious violence with police and other partners

Next steps :

- Relational toolkit and Behaviour pathways documents updated and shared Pan-Lancashire

Addresses all four priorities

Social work practice

Actions proposed :

- Work with Blackpool to share best practice specifically around the family safeguarding model.
- Set up a regular meeting between social work managers and three authorities to share best practice and data

Addresses all four priorities

Co-location of Services

Actions completed :

- Family hubs/Early Years managers to meet regularly and share best practice
- Work with public health to roll out the Balanced System for speech and language Pan-Lancashire
- Music hub joint bid for funding
- Great Lancashire Debate

Next steps

- Storytelling Day Pan Lancashire

Addresses all four priorities

Increasing EET

Actions completed :

- Creation of Pan-Lancashire protocol for transition from school/college including data sharing agreements
- Creation of Shared NEET strategy and all three authorities to join together to bid for funding
- Targeted transition project with 150 pupils in 15 schools
- Skills pledge and Care Covenant to encourage businesses to work with young people/schools
- All alternative provision schools to have access to funding to assist transition to Key Stage 5

Next steps

- Organise Primary Careers project focusing on directory of visitors/careers fairs/resources etc
- Facilitate college/primaries working together on career based curriculum
- Pan Lancashire Colleges delivering information about T-Levels to Primary/Secondary schools
- Communications to be strengthened around options in Lancashire for post 16 for parents and young people
- Discussion around transport and how this could be improved or have reduced cost. Pan-Lancashire
Addresses all four priorities

Data Observatory

- These are some of the proposed measures to define success of the projects :
- Decrease the % Gap between disadvantaged and advantaged children/SEND and non SEND at KS2 and KS4
- Increase % of families accessing Family Hubs for support
- Increase % of school attendance of children looked after, disadvantaged, SEND, children with a social worker or open to CFW support.
- Decrease % of permanent exclusions and suspensions
- Less children on CIN/CP plans and CLA

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
